Health: Female Health Issues

In line with Women's Day, 9 August, we thought it would be appropriate to have a look at three female specific health issues.

Mammary Hyperplasia

Most common in young cats, mammary hyperplasia occurs in unspayed cats. The condition occurs a week or two after a cat's first heat cycle and results in enlarged breast glands.

High levels of progesterone cause the condition, which can be painful.

If she has a severe case of this condition, she'll have a rapid increase in breast size, discoloration, warmth, pain and ulceration of her skin over the swollen breast.

In a very severe case the veins in her breast can clot, causing the cat to die suddenly if the clot breaks free and travels to her lungs.

The best treatment for this condition is spaying her. If she's pregnant, talk to your vet to determine what the least risky course of treatment is for her.

Breast Tumors

One of the most compelling reasons to spay her is to help her avoid breast tumors, which occur frequently in cats who haven't been fixed.

80 percent of breast tumors in cats are malignant and breast cancer is the third most common cancer in cats.

Cats older than 6 years of age tend to be a greater risk. The chance of contracting this cancer is greatly reduced if she is spayed, particularly before her first heat cycle.

Feline breast cancer progresses rapidly, spreads widely and has a high rate of recurrence after treatment. Treatment usually involves surgically removing the tumors, sometimes accompanied with chemotherapy. Cats who haven't been spayed should have breast examinations monthly.



Pyometra

Unspayed cats are more prone to ovarian cysts and uterine infections because their hormone levels fluctuate so frequently. Pyometra, a potentially Lifethreatening condition, is a severe bacterial infection of the uterus.

The uterine lining of an unspayed cat can thicken and form cysts, creating a fertile breeding ground for bacteria. She may vomit, have a swollen abdomen or be lethargic if she develops Pyometra, ultimately requiring surgery to remove her uterus and ovaries. Occasionally antibiotics and fluid therapy are required for recovery.

Health: Aging Cats

Many cat experts feel that, from a medical viewpoint, a cat is considered to be in its geriatric years when it reaches ten years old. The years take their toll on the cat's body, and just like its human companions, there are numerous changes caused by the aging process. Every organ is affected as the years progress. Generally, an older cat is less active and tends to sleep more than it did in its younger years. Due to the inactivity, the cat experiences reduced muscle tone. This makes activities such as climbing, running and jumping difficult. Many elderly cats only jump up to find a comfortable spot to sleep.

Health Problems of Elderly Cats

In addition to reduced muscle tone, an elderly feline also commonly experiences:

- A decrease in its sense of taste, smell, hearing and sight
- A decrease in the temperature of its body, making it more sensitive to heat and cold
- Decreased metabolism
- Deceased appetite and weight loss
- Reduced bowel function and possible constipation
- Incontinence
- Dehydration caused by a decreased sensitivity to the feeling of being thirsty
- Difficulty swallowing due to a reduction in saliva production
- Problems with digestion
- Brittle, weak bones and claws
- Possible obesity due to inactivity
- Behavior changes

Health Problems Affecting Major Organs

While all health problems of geriatric felines are serious, the following conditions and diseases affect major organs.

Heart Problems

Cardiac problems often develop in elderly cats. As the heart ages, it is not able to pump blood as efficiently as it once did. Sometimes a heart murmur, newly discovered during a routine veterinary visit, is the first indication of possible heart disease. One of the most common cardiac problems of aged cats is hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. This condition leads to the heart muscle becoming abnormally stiff and thick.



Liver Disease

When the liver ages, it loses its ability to adequately purify and remove toxins from the cat's blood. There is also a decrease in the number of enzymes it produces. Hepatic Lipidosis, commonly referred to as Fatty Liver disease, is a common health problem of elderly cats.

Kidney Disease

The older the cat, the higher the chance of it developing kidney disease, also known as renal disease. This happens because of the inability of the heart to pump enough blood to the kidneys or because of the kidneys themselves. Generally, the first sign of kidney problems is a noticeable increase of water intake and urination.

Decreased Lung Function

As lungs age, they become stiffer and are not able to supply enough oxygen to the body through the bloodstream. This is one reason elderly cats tire easily. They are also more likely to develop respiratory infection. If a cat has asthma, it generally worsens as the feline ages.

Additional Elderly Feline Health Problems

Diseases and illnesses can affect cats of all ages. However, elderly felines are more susceptible as their bodies and immune systems are weakened from the natural process of aging.


Cancer

Cancer is a major health problem of elderly cats. Two common feline cancers are intestinal lymphoma, which is a malignant tumor in the lymph nodes of the intestines and lymphosarcoma, a cancer of the white blood cells.

Dental Disease

Dental disease is a common health problem of elderly cats. Many aged felines have poor teeth and gums resulting in loss of teeth, periodontal disease and mouth ulcers.
